With the mass amount of books out there, finding the right one can be difficult. Dewey Delve is an Amazon Kindle app that allows users to enter the genre of book they wish to read and the app gives users book options that meet these specifications. Book publishers will pay to have their books listed on Dewey Delve by giving 10% of each book bought through the app.

Readers often know what kind of book they want to read but not how to find such a book. Dewey Delve fixes this issue. A user types in what kind of book they are looking for and the application provides them with multiple choices. The user can specify a genre, an age range, the length, the gender of the lead, etcetera. Dewey Delve then takes this information and picks books that the reader might be interested in. A user can also enter in books they have read and enjoyed as well as books they disliked, and the app will take it into consideration when giving the user options. There is a comment section on every book so users can share their opinions and give insight to other readers to help them with their selection. The app connects to the Amazon online store so users can buy the book they want directly from Dewey Delve.

Publishers would pay a 10% commission from sales generated through Dewey Delve in order to have their books listed for readers to possibly purchase. There would also be sponsored books on Dewey Delve's homepage that publishers would pay for the right to have their book listed as such. Authors can also list their self-published books on Dewey Delve, as long as they are available on Amazon.
