
Imagine having a high tech security system streaming right from your gaming console. With Secure 360, you can purchase incognito security cameras to put around your home, and they will all be controlled right from your Xbox 360 console. The cameras will stream live security coverage to the main console, which can stream coverage to any mobile device. The peace of mind that comes with constantly being able to keep an eye on your home when you are away is guaranteed to bring in massive revenue streams.

The Xbox 360 console is the center of the security system, with all data streaming to it. The user would download the Secure 360 application to any device from which they wish to view the live stream, and the cameras would feed to the Xbox, which distributes the feed to all other devices. The same way you would purchase multiple cable boxes for individual rooms in your home, you purchase as many cameras as you need for your home. Cameras run between 20-30 dollars per camera, depending on the features of that specific camera. The cameras will be small, basic cameras, so they are producer and consumer friendly. Ideally, these will be mass-produced for a far lower cost, so we will generate profit off of the sales. Additionally, there will be a monthly subscription fee to have the cameras stream to the Xbox main console which allows streaming to various mobile devices.
