


DATA


- Intel Center based in Alexandria, VA

 - •This data set is about the personal information of terrorists.

SCENARIO

- 1. Does the birthplace of a member affect which cluster he is recruited into or joins?
 - Influential terrorists?
- 2. Do members join in their native country or elsewhere?
 - Movement and network building
- 3. Does birthplace influence member role?
 - Nationality influences role or rank?

CONCLUSIONS

- We learned that the members' clusters are based geographically and that most members of the Jihad are subordinates, regardless of their birthplace.
 - France and Saudi Arabia were countries in which native-born also join the Jihad
 - Afghanistan included plenty of Egyptians that joined the Jihad
 - Egypt has the most members participating in a military committee, and the least number of subordinates (is the outlier)
