WordPress

Our company can gain a net benefit of \$2,451,000 over the next three years by investing in WordPress. WordPress is a free, open-source content management platform that enables our developers to build applications using pre-set templates. This will improve their efficiency, thus reducing our headcount.

WordPress is a platform that allows our developers to develop applications much faster. Traditionally, developers have to build an application by writing multiple lines of code. With WordPress, they can build an application on top of its platform rather than from scratch. Instead of spending hours coding an application, they can choose various themes and plugins available on WordPress to develop an application which meets the required functionality. This method of web development reduces the time taken to complete their tasks, which reduces our headcount from twelve to five developers.

The three-year cost of using WordPress is \$174,000, which includes hardware and software purchases, annual maintenance, and employee training and lost productivity. We will save \$875,000 per year from the reduction in headcount, which adds up to \$2,625,000 over three years. This will result in a net benefit of \$2,451,000 over three years.
