 Both teams are known as the best teams ever assembled in NBA history and is widely debated.


How?

- Advanced player statistics used to represent how good each individual player was compared to all other NBA players.


Data Used

- Key Elements
 - SRS: Rating taking into account average point differential and strength of schedule
 - Win/ Loss Percentage: Wins / Total Games Played
 - Average Margin of Victory/ Loss: Average point differential
 - Value Over Replacement: Statistic takes into account players' value
 - Defensive Win Share: Defensive contribution that resulted in wins
 - Player Efficiency Rating: per minute production for the team









