

Installing Visual Studio Code (on a Mac)

Be sure to ...

Create a place to keep your work

1. Make a folder on your desktop called mis2402workspace
2. Make sure that the Finder on your laptop is set to show the full file name, including the file extension part of the name!

To do that, got to the Finder menu, Finder Preferences and then see: Advanced and check “Show all filename extensions”

Make sure you have the Chrome browser installed and that it is your default browser

4. Go get it off the Internet, here:

5. Put an alias to VS Code on your desktop.
6. Make sure that you have installed the Visual Studio Code extension “open in browser” by TechER
