

- Framed by the affordances, signifiers, constraints and mappings

"Everyone forms stories (conceptual models) to explain what they have observed." —Don Norman




What happens if we (UX designers) don't create a

clear conceptual model?


As designers, we have obligations


- Designers have an obligation to ensure that the behavior of the machine is understandable to the people who interact with them.
- Strive to minimize the chance of inappropriate actions through the design framework
- Use affordances, signifiers, mapping and constraints to guide actions




Tricks used in websites and apps that make you do things that you didn't mean to, like buying or signing up for something.






HTML Tag Overview for Text Formatting

It is important to have a basic understanding of HTML tags that are applied to all text. This will help you better understand:

- The Guttenberg Wordpress Editor functionality.
- Will help with consistency across the site in styling.
- Will be important later for Accessibility Issues.

- → **<H1>**: Used only once per page for main heading.
- → <H2>, <H3>, <H4>, <H5>, <H6>: Can be used for multiple headings per page, but always in order.
- → <P>: Used for paragraphs of type
- → : Unordered List (bulleted list)
- → : Ordered List (number list)
- → **** Slockquote***: Block quote, typically has built in styling to define the look as a "quote"
